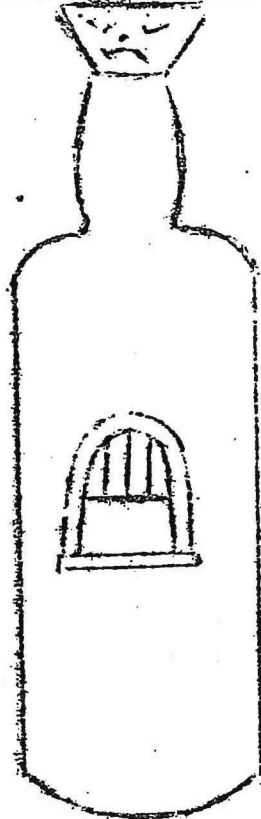
TRAINS

Two new missionaries, Mr. and Mrs. Bowney, are coming up to help us soon.

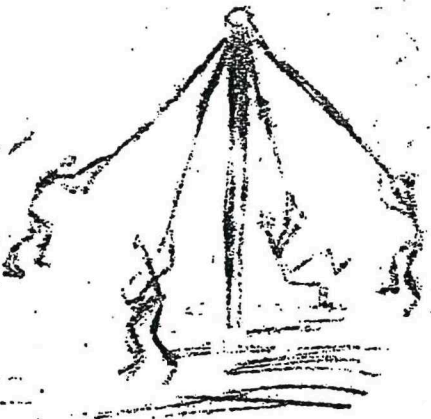

The friends of Bruce will be sorry to hear of his death at the Kalgoorlie Hospital this month.




A new razzle dazzle (or giant stride) has been erected near the other one, which is now mended. Also a horizontal ladder has been put up.



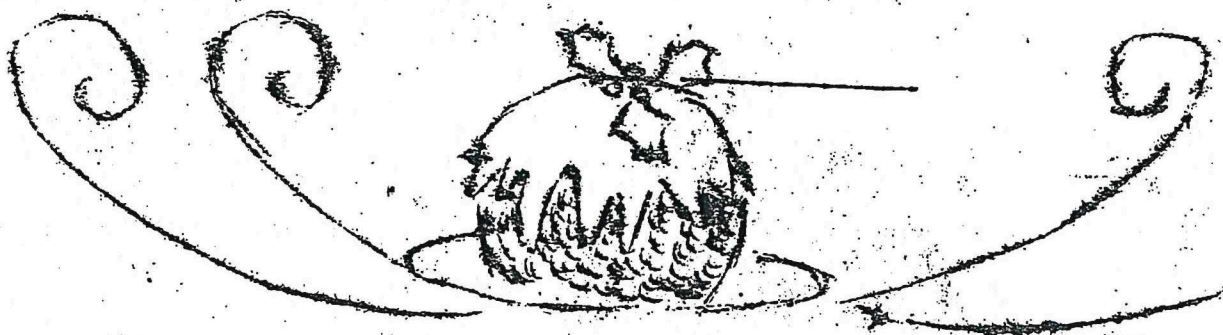
