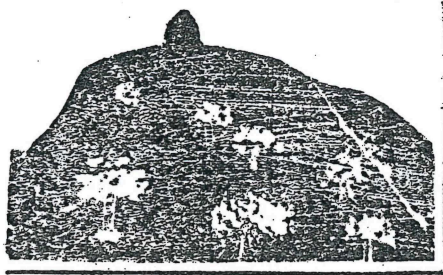

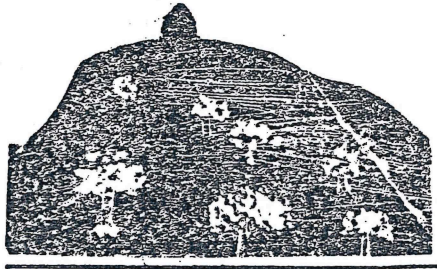
Our big truck recently took on a new look when a substantial frame was affixed to it and a load of bullocks carted from Cosmo Newbery to Leonora.

Quite a few folk have been finding small pieces of gold here and there.

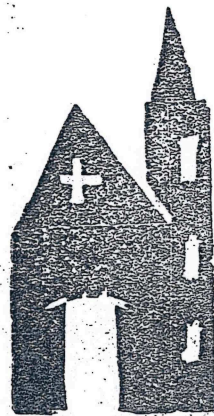

Matt. 7:7

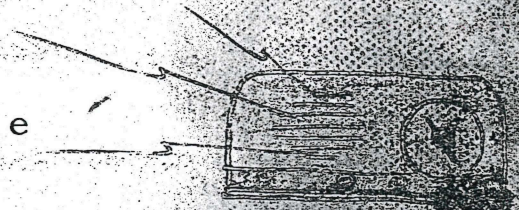


And God spake all these words, saying . . .
